# Credicorp Flex risk note: Cash Reserves

A sourced risk note for directors weighing Credicorp Flex against cash reserves, supplier terms and the wider Credicorp product family.

Cash reserves are the first defence against timing gaps, but they are not always enough for a dated cost. Approval is never the point by itself; the useful test is whether the company can repay without creating the next gap.

Credicorp Flex belongs in the comparison when cash reserves creates repeated short gaps that should be drawn and repaid in cycles. If the same pressure repeats, pause and compare terms, reserves or a facility before using a one-off fix.

Do not drain reserves to zero if the next trading week still needs stock, payroll or rent. The external links keep the page anchored to public material rather than sales copy.

For Credicorp Flex, the discipline is to draw for short needs and repay when receipts land, not to treat the limit as extra revenue.
