Credicorp Flex product-routing guide: Contract Mobilisation

A sourced product-routing guide for directors weighing Credicorp Flex against cash reserves, supplier terms and the wider Credicorp product family.

A contract can require staff, stock or materials before the first payment arrives. The first check is whether the cost is dated, evidenced and likely to clear from a known receipt.

Credicorp Flex belongs in the comparison when contract mobilisation creates repeated short gaps that should be drawn and repaid in cycles. That means fixing the amount before comparing rates, fees or monthly comfort.

Keep the signed contract, purchase order and mobilisation budget together before drawing. The links below are the source checks used for this page.

For Credicorp Flex, the discipline is to draw for short needs and repay when receipts land, not to treat the limit as extra revenue.
