# Credicorp Slice report: security upgrade invoice

A report on paying a cyber or premises security supplier without delaying a needed upgrade.

Security upgrades can be urgent after an audit, incident or insurance requirement. The first check is whether the cost is dated, evidenced and likely to clear from a known receipt.

Credicorp Slice can fit a defined supplier invoice for security work. That means fixing the amount before comparing rates, fees or monthly comfort.

Keep evidence of the risk being reduced. Security spend should close a real gap, not decorate a checklist. The links below are the source checks used for this page.

For Credicorp Slice, start with the supplier invoice. If there is no defined bill to spread, it is probably the wrong route.
